

Construction: How to handle deliveries?

Deliveries pose a risk of contamination. It is important to ensure the times that incoming and outgoing suppliers arrive and leave is spread out as much as possible.

A number of guidelines regarding deliveries

- Execute orders by telephone and by email as much as possible.
- Work with a registration system on the construction site, and appoint a person to be notified.
- Close the site gate, also during the day, and display telephone number(s) for arrivals to contact.
- Try to stagger deliveries.
- Designate a waiting zone and drive-through zone, separate the loading and unloading zones from the site locations as much as possible.
- Only employees for each contractor, recipient and supplier involved should touch their own equipment.
 Do not allow employees on the site to come into contact with a truck, van or parts thereof (crane, material, etc.)
- If third parties arrive at the yard, they must provide their own PPE.
- Delivery notes must not be left behind physically, and they are only to be signed off by the employee delivering the equipment. The receipts are to be sent digitally
